In Person Worship resumes June 7th!

The church has been closed to In-Person worship since March 22nd. This is to minimize the spread of Covid-19. But the Leadership Team of the church believes it is time to resume meeting together for worship. A great deal of thought and conversation surrounds the decision to resume in-person worship in the Sanctuary on Sunday, June 7th.

With Caution and Care!

We will follow guidelines from the Texas Department of State Health Services to provide the safest setting possible. So, expect a few changes as we meet for worship.

To ensure proper spacing and social distancing in the Sanctuary we will leave every other row of pews empty and ask members to maintain six feet of separation. Members of the same household may certainly set next to one another as well as individuals who are attending together.

Singing intensifies the transmission of droplets from the mouth that present a source of transmission. In order to reduce the risk of transmission from droplets there will be NO CONGREGATIONAL singing. We will sing with our hearts.

<u>Face masks</u> are highly encouraged. They serve to reduce the transmission and reception of the virus.

The Sanctuary will be cleaned and sanitized to the best of our ability. Hand sanitizer will be readily available. We will make sure the restrooms have an ample supply of soap.

Use your own judgment!

The Department of Health encourages the "at-risk population" to participate remotely. That would include people 65 or older and/or individuals with health issues. Anyone experiencing Covid-19 symptoms or anyone running a fever should remain home.

We are doing our best to provide a safe environment, so use your own judgment.

County Updates!

Currently the number of confirmed cases in DeWitt county is low. But Gonzales county is experiencing a rise in cases. We will monitor the state website daily for updates and respond accordingly if there is a cause for concern.
