



Love Is The Answer

As a recent graduate of seminary and just as a pastor we are asked many times what theologian we most identify with. I find the one who guides my ministry and my life is Bishop Michael Curry. He is the Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church. He became renowned when he was asked to deliver the sermon at the wedding of Prince Harry and Megan Markle.

Bishop Curry doesn't have a complex theological doctrine that he teaches. He teaches that to be and do what God wants we simply need to love. He believes that if we lead from love then many of the problems and disputes of the world will be worked out because we love. He believes that everything we do must come from the heart of love. And I have become convinced that he is right. Love is what allows us to build a bridge rather than put up a wall.

You see too many people have a misconception about what it means to love. We think that love means holding hands and singing Kum Ba Ya. But that is a very immature idea about what love really is.

You see it is not a stretch to love the people that I would hold hands with and sing. Those people are the ones that usually think and feel like I do. They are the ones that validate who I am whether and what I believe. They are the ones that love me because I am like them.

But what happens when we meet that person that is different from us for whatever reason? Maybe they are a different race, a different physical appearance, speak a different language, are a different religion, or a different political ideology, or love differently than I think they should or just think about the world differently than we do. What happens when "those" individuals come into our sphere of life?

Too many times we put them into the category of "them". And we set in motion the them vs us dilemma. Because they are different we make the unconscious decision to hold then at a distance. They are definitely not the holding hands and singing people that we think about when we so often say love.

But I want you to think about Jesus. In the Gospels, Jesus was the person who loved the people that the Pharisees and other Jews were casting to the side. Jesus loved the unlovable in the eyes of the world. The people that were the hardest to love and the people that no one else would love. He loved the ones who were screaming at the top of their lungs "crucify him". Jesus hanging on the cross not only loved us, he prayed for our forgiveness.

Now understand that this is a radical kind of love. And as long as we are still holding on the immature concept of love we will never be able to embrace the radical love that Jesus lived his whole life.

You see Christian love means that you have to love the people that you don't want to love. They are the people that think so differently than you that your blood boils when you hear what they say. They are the people that do things so differently than you that you can't believe that they are God's beloved children. They are they ones that push all your buttons and make you want to lose your mind. These are the people that we are called to love. They are the "those" people and the "them" people.

God calls us to do away with the labels of them and us and embrace the WE. We are called to love all of God's children. We are called to love the ones who love us back and the ones that we dislike more than anything in the world. It doesn't say in the Bible that we have to agree with everyone. It doesn't say that we have to like the behavior of people especially when we see them doing wrong. But we are called to love. Jesus didn't tell us that we have to hold hands and sing with them. But we do have to love them.

That means praying for them when all we want to do is curse them. That means sometimes we have to take the first step and try to build a relationship with them. A relationship that is based on the teachings of Christ. A relationship based on love. We reach out and love because they are made in the image of the same God that created us.

Love is the answer. Relationship is the answer. There will always be individuals that we will never agree with but there is not a single person that we shouldn't love. God calls us to be the bridge that ends divisiveness and brokenness in our world. And the building blocks for that bridge is love. Love is the answer.
