I See You. I Hear You.

A couple of weeks ago I was in Austin attending a meeting at the Capital. In that meeting, there was a young woman that was not dressed like most of the people who were in meetings at the Capital. She was wearing flip-flops, shorts, and a sweatshirt. She seemed to be agitated somewhat and I thought that maybe she was with some of the other people who were attending the meeting. As the meeting progressed, this woman became more and more agitated. She began speaking out inappropriately during the presentation. Several of the people in the meeting would go and whisper to her to try to get her to stop. At one point, someone took her out to talk to her. However, she came back in and was just as agitated and began to cry silently. People watched her, stared at her but no one really was seeing or listening to her. They were simply trying to alleviate a distraction to the meeting. Once the meeting was over and people began, to leave the woman began shouting and cussing and once again, the people just stared and went to get someone who could deal with her.

I think that for too many of us this is how we handle the broken people of the world. There are so many souls that are out there not dressed appropriately, agitated, sad, shouting out that they need something. And for many of us we simply stare and hope that someone else will take care of them. We just want them to stop being the distraction.

But I believe that these are the very people that Christ is calling us to minister to. These are the people that Jesus would have gone out of his way to be in relationship with. These are the people that he knew needed someone to see them and to listen to them. These are who he was talking about when he said love your neighbor. These are our neighbors.

When I saw what was going on with the woman at the Capital, I went over to her and in a soft voice I asked her what did she need. And she began to tell me her story. And breaking COVID-19 protocol I reached out my hand to her and said I'm listening and I see you. She broke down in tears and continued to tell me about how much she missed her mother that had died and some of the struggles that she was facing. She simply needed someone to acknowledge that she was seen and that someone, anyone was listening to her. I worked with one of the DPS officers to get her some help. But what could have been a confrontation became the opportunity for myself and the officer to help someone who was lost and struggling. The interaction did not cost me anything. It really did not take much time. But it helped one of God's beloved children be seen and heard.

How much better would our world be if we as Christians decided that we were going to make sure and see people? See the pain on their face and in their eyes. What if we listened to more than just the words when people spoke? What if we listened between the lines to hear the longing and pain? What if we simply loved them and began to build relationships with our fellow brothers and sisters? Imagine what our world would be like.

I have a friend that usually tells me at some time in almost every conversation that we have that he sees me, hears me. Those simple words can change a person's day. The action of listening and seeing someone as they are, not as they should be is life changing. Let us go out into the brokenness of the world and see and listen to God's beloved children. We see you and we are listening. Let us go in the Holy Spirit to change the world.




